- Planned and delivered high-level convenings, stakeholder dialogues, and donor engagements, increasing programme visibility and cross-sector collaboration.
- Oversaw programme workplans, reporting cycles, and learning processes, ensuring alignment with donor requirements, MEL standards, and accountability frameworks.
- Supported organizational expansion and programme development initiatives, contributing to increased donor confidence and follow-on funding opportunities.
- Led the design and implementation of a Women in Frontline Extractive Communities intervention across 16 Niger Delta host communities, developing an interest-free cooperative financing model that provided structured social safety nets and revolving livelihood capital for 182 women. Established governance bylaws, transparent beneficiary selection criteria, and repayment monitoring systems to ensure accountability, financial sustainability, and community ownership beyond the initial funding cycle.
- Conceptualized and led the development of a national digital reporting platform for mining host communities, enabling structured reporting of gender-based violence (GBV), environmental degradation, and community development project implementation gaps. Managed software developers directly from requirements gathering through deployment, defined functional specifications and accountability workflows, and integrated safeguarding and verification mechanisms to strengthen transparency, citizen reporting, and institutional oversight within the extractive sector (hostcommunities.ng).
- Led the formal revision process of the Community Development Agreement (CDA) Guidelines of the Federal Ministry of Solid Minerals Development, providing technical leadership and

coordinating multi-stakeholder consultations to strengthen inclusion frameworks. Successfully advanced provisions mandating the participation of women, youth, and persons with disabilities (PWDs) in extractive-sector community development planning, enhancing accountability and equitable benefit-sharing in mining host communities.

Designed and operationalized the project MEL framework, including baseline and endline assessments, indicator tracking tools, and community feedback mechanisms. Supervised field enumerators ensured gender- and disability-sensitive data collection, and strengthened evidence-based advocacy by embedding inclusion metrics that prioritised women and persons with disabilities (PWDs) in community charter development processes.
- Designed and oversaw implementation of the Malala Fund–supported Community Led Collective Action for Girls Education (C-CAGE) project in insurgency-affected and vulnerable communities in Adamawa State. Led multi-layered intervention combining advocacy with traditional leaders, community mobilization, skills acquisition support, and structured enrolment drives. The project facilitated the enrolment of 3,265 teenage girls into formal education—1,350 during the funded cycle and an additional 1,915 post-project, demonstrating sustained community ownership and long-term impact beyond donor funding.
